

ELEMENTARY EDUCATION CERTIFICATION (P-5)

PROGRAM DETAILS



- Provides a tuition assisted pathway and academic support to receive a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education to fulfill K-5 teaching positions in Kentucky from the University of Louisville (UofL).
- Students participate in the Metro College (MC) program for 3 1/2 years working third shift at UPS and enroll in no more than 13 credit hours each fall, spring, and summer semesters.
- Students will work with an assigned UofL Academic Advisor.
- Students will complete 240 hours of field experience on Fridays, summers, and beginning and end of the fall and spring semesters when UofL is not in session.

METRO COLLEGE BENEFITS

- 100% UofL tuition deferred*
- \$500 bonus each fall and spring semester with successful completion of 6 or more credit hours and no withdrawals, incompletes, failures or grades of D
- Fee payment assistance up to \$250 each fall and spring semester
- Customized career coaching

*Tuition is paid at the Kentucky undergraduate full-time resident rate

UPS EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

- Starting pay rate \$21 per hour
- Receive health, dental, vision, prescription, and life insurance coverage after 9 months of employment
- Receive paid vacation and holidays after 1 year of employment
- Ability to purchase UPS stock
- 401K Contributions

EDUCATION PATHWAY BENEFITS

In the last semester of the program, students will work at a Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) school as an Instructional Assistant (Option 9) and earn 12 hours of student teaching credit. Students will also complete 1-credit hour on-line Capstone Course. *Must meet employment eligibility criteria*

- Instructional Assistant starting pay is \$19.01-\$22.01/per hour
- Positions are 187 days and subject to escrow
- Employees under Option 9, once they are hired, do not receive benefits until the second month after full employment
- To obtain healthcare insurance during the interim period, students can:

-Apply for the UofL Primary Care Health Fee (https://louisville.edu/campushealth/information/fees) while not enrolled in a medical insurance policy

- -Students enrolled in 6.5 credit hours can pay \$150 during the last Spring semester which provides primary services at the Cardinal Station of Health Science Center offices of the Campus Health Services
- -If eligible, apply through your parent/guardian insurance plan

FUTURE HIRING

- When students successfully graduate, they will be in high priority hiring status as new hire.
- All Jefferson County Teachers Association (JCTA) transfer rules will be followed meaning sitting teachers wanting to transfer will get first rights to openings per the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA).

12 CREDITS OF UOFL TUITION PAID BY:

- A 25% grant-based tuition reduction for the last semester of undergraduate tuition at UofL.
- Apply for JCPS tuition assistance. It is not guaranteed, and a distribution of funds depends on the number of eligible employees requesting benefit.
- Opt into the Commonwealth Credit Union (CCU) Savings Plan. The CCU savings plan option will require students in the program to make a \$5-\$30 a week direct deposit starting at the beginning of the program. Students will also save their MC semester bonuses and MC fee payments. This savings will help cover tuition, living and healthcare expenses in the final semester of your program.



• CCU Scholarship. Those receiving the award will receive up to \$2,000 in the final semester of the program if program requirements are fulfilled.

SEMESTER SCHEDULE

Students will work with an assigned UofL Academic Advisor to ensure course selection starting noon or after each day and courses that adhere to the 4-year program overview. MC students will complete their 240 hours of field experience on Fridays, summers, and at the beginning and end of the fall and spring semesters when UofL is not in session.
